Course Outcome

Subject: POLITICAL SCIENCE

SEMESTER II

CC 3 Political Theory Concepts and Debates PLSACOR03T

This course will help the students familiarize with the basic normative concepts of political theory which are related to crucial political issues that require analysis with the help of our conceptual understanding.

CC4 Political Process in India PLSACOR04T

The course maps the working of "modern" institutions. The students get to know the working of the Indian state paying attention to the contradictory dynamics of modern state power.

GE/DSC2 Indian Government and Politics PLSGCOR02T

The course acquaints students with the constitutional design of state structures and institutions and their actual working over time.

SEMESTER IV

CC8 Political Processes and Institutions in Comparative Perspective PLSACOR08T

In this course the students will know the application of comparative methods to the study of politics. Comparative methods with a wide range of issues and literature will be introduced to them.

CC9 Public Policy and Administration in India PLSACOR09T

The essence of public policy lies in its effectiveness in translating the governing philosophy into programs and policies and making it a part of community living .The course seeks to provide an understanding of the issues of decentralisation, financial management, socialwelfare from a non western perspective.

CC10 Global Politics PLSACOR10T

The course offers insights to the students into key contemporary global issues such as the proliferation of nuclear weapons, ecological issues, international terrorism, and human security. In keeping with the most important debates within the globalization discourse, it imparts an understanding of the working of the world economy while analyzing the changing nature of relationship between the state and transnational actors.

GE/DSC Introduction to International Relations PLSGCOR04T

This paper seeks to equip students with the basic understanding if international relations. It introduces the students to some of the most important theoretical approaches for studying international relations.

SEMESTER VI

CC13 Modern Political Philosophy PLSACOR13T

The students will get to know the manner in which the questions of politics have been posed in terms that have implications for larger questions of thought and reference. Students will know about the contemporary political philosophy and debates.

CC14 Indian Political Thought II PLSACOR14T

Based on the study of individual thinkers the course will introduce to a wide span of thinkers and themes that defines the modernity of Indian political thought.

DSE Human Rights in a Comparative Perspective PLSADSE05T

This course attempts to build an understanding of human rights among students through a study of specific issues in a comparative perspective. The course seeks to anchor all issues in the Indian context, and pulls out another country to form a comparative frame work.

DSE Governance Issues and Challenges PLSADSE06T

The course will help the students to understand the different dimensions of governance in the context of a globalising world, environment, administration, development. The essence of governance is explored through the various good governance initiatives introduced in India.

DSE (for General) Understanding Global Politics PLSGDSE03T

The course will provide a comprehensive understanding of the multilateral political organizations in international relations and their functioning.

Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) Public Opinion and Survey Research PLSSSEC02M

The course will introduce the students to the debates, principles and practices of public opinion polling in the context of democracies, with special reference to India. It will familiarize the students with how to conceptualize and measure public opinion using quantitative methods with particular attention being paid to developing basic skills pertaining to the collection, analysis and utilization of quantitative data.
